Editorial: In The Name of Rev Joe **By Rebecca Doggett & Gregory Giacobe**

Sunday, 30 September 2018, has turned out to be a day to celebrate the Faith plus Works of a retired minister activist who made a difference to hundreds of young people in Orange. Now deceased, Rev Joseph J. Thomasbeger is remembered for his faith plus works. Rev Joe was the minister of North Orange Baptist Church in 1967 when families in his neighborhood began to lose their homes and recreational centers with the construction of Route 280.

The highway took Friendship House, as well as the racially segregated YMCA and YWCA. So Rev Joe formed a partnership with the YMCA Operation Aspiration headed by Bob Slatter and started The Outpost at North Orange Church. The program offered recreation, family services and college guidance to families. This work was possible because many members of North Orange became volunteers in the program. In partnership with Rev Richard Schoolmaster of Grace Episcopal Church, Rev Joe became a strong advocate for the expansion of early childhood services. Back in the 1970's, Rev Joe also worked with the clergy of First UU on community issues in Orange.

Rev Joe retired from church based ministry in early 1980, but continued his urban ministry as an early childhood advocate in Newark and throughout the state. Joe's reconnection to First UU began in the last few years when, as a member of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation at Montclair, he enthusiastically supported the

joint conversations about partnering and the creating of a new urban ministry program. Although parts of that initial vision have fallen away, the urban ministry concept became the HUUB. And, until his death in December of last year, Joe actively supported the HUUB's presence and work.

Now his friends, family and community would like to honor Joe with two special ceremonies. We invite you to join the HUUB in naming its fellows program The Joe

Thomasberger Community Fellows Program. The naming ceremony will take place as the Faith plus Works service on Sunday, 30 September at 5pm at First Unitarian Universalist Church of Essex, 35 Cleveland Street, Orange, NJ. Please see page 2 of this newsletter for further details.

In addition, at 3:30 PM that same afternoon, the Orange Municipal Council will conduct a memorial naming of Hickory Street after Joe. The site of the naming will be the former site of the North Orange Baptist Church at Hickory and South Main Street. Please see page 3 for further details.

Joe was an extraordinary man who touched and transformed many lives with both his faith and works, in God, in his fellow human, and in the ways we can bring out the best in each other. Let us honor both the man and the spirit of Rev Joe for his lasting faith plus works. Please join us for both events, in the name of Rev Joe!


HONORARY STREET NAMING



Four UU Churches Receive Chalice Lighter Grants

2018 has been a bumper crop year for Chalice Lighters Grants: to date, the Grant Committee has awarded funds to enable four UU churches in the Central East Region (CER) to grow and thrive. The four grants – totaling \$100,000 – will support major projects at these congregations throughout the region:

At the **UU Church of Hamburg, NY**, a new wheelchair ramp and indoor lift will increase the church's accessibility—creating a welcoming, full-service congregation for all, not just the able-bodied.

The **Unitarian Society of Germantown** in Philadelphia, established in 1865, will install an elevator, making all three floors accessible. "Meeting the needs of those with disabilities is an important moral as well as legal imperative," members say.

In Ohio, the **SouthWest UU Church in N. Royalton** is literally a beacon on a hill—sitting at the highest point in town and topped with a landmark steeple. With its grant, the congregation will be able to renovate its worn steeple for safety and preservation.

At the **Unitarian Church of Harrisburg, PA**, a new grant will enable the church to expand outreach through its Chalice Center by renovating its downtown Market Street campus, further serving the surrounding multicultural, low-income neighborhood.


