TO THE CLERK OF THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS, ESSEX COUNTY, NEW JERSEY.

We hereby certify that on the 16th day of March, 1890, the time agreed upon and after due previous notice of a'v least ten days as shown by the annexed affidavit, which is made part hereof, the Unitarians of the Oranges and vicinity duly elected seven persons out, of the number of said society as trustees to serve for one year, the following persons:

That such election resulted from a plurality of the voices of the adults of both sexes present at such meeting and who regularly contribute to the support of said society.

That all said trustees have accepted said election and have taken as the name and legal designation of said Religious Society the following. "The First Unitarian Church of Losex County."

That the Society is and is intended to be incorporated under the Laws of New Jersey and more especially under an act entitled, "An Act to Incorporate Trustees of Religious Societies," Revision approved 9th April, 1875, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto.
